COVID-19 KNOWN AS NOVEL CORONAVIRUS:

Mason County has no new confirmed cases of COVID-19. We still only have one (1) confirmed case from March 17, 2020.

REMINDER: 911 is for emergencies, not a source of information. Please only call 911 if you are having an emergency and require law enforcement, fire or medical services.

HOW IS MASON COUNTY RESPONDING?

Mason County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is fully operational. Mason County agencies and jurisdictions are working together to keep citizens of Mason County informed with timely and accurate information on COVID-19.

- Testing will continue, increasing once more test kits are received.
- Mason County Public Health is conducting contact interviews regarding the confirmed case of COVID-19 in Mason County and if you are a contact from anywhere in the world, you will be notified.
- Information is being compiled and released as quickly as possible then forwarded out through the Mason County Joint Information Center (JIC).

WHAT DO CITIZENS NEED TO KNOW?

- At the time of this printing, Mason County still only has one (1) confirmed case of COVID-19 from March 17, 2020.
- Please continue to show compassion toward one another and practice Social Distancing.
- Governor Jay Inslee passed six (6) more Proclamations on March 18, 2020. For more information and to stay up to date, check the Governors website at: <https://www.governor.wa.gov/office-governor/official-actions/proclamations>
- Many agencies, organizations, and business are running on essential personnel only, working from home or have shut down for now. Please check websites or call ahead.

- Many 24-hours grocery stores have expanded their limiting store hours reserving designated time for “at-risk shoppers” such as the elderly, pregnant women and more. Please contact your local grocery store or check their website for specific details and to confirm store hours.

Hospital and Medical Facilities:

Beginning Thursday, March 19, Mason Health will be offering a drive-through testing location for patients with symptoms of coronavirus and are high risk. These tests are **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY** and **must be pre-screened and scheduled through the Covid-19 Respiratory Triage Call Line (360 427-3615)**. If the patient presents to the clinic as a walk-in, screening may be done at the clinic following the usual process at this time. At this time, we will not be accepting any patients through the new drive-through testing site who have not been pre-screened.
